



## "Starting from fish-shape Paumanok, where I was born ...."



The WALT WHITMAN BIRTHPLACE ASSOCIATION was organized in 1949 and purchased Whitman's birthplace to safeguard it for future generations. In 1957, the Birthplace Association gave New York State title to property.

The Association, working in cooperation with NYS Office of Parks, Recreation & Historic Preservation, preserves the house where the poet was born and lived the early years of his life, and makes the poet's life and work accessible to all through guided tours, school and public programs and exhibits. The farm house was built by Walt's father circa 1810 and Walt was born here on May 31, 1819.

At the modern Interpretive Center, built in 1997, visitors delve deeply into Whitman's life and poetry through a series of engaging exhibits with 130 portraits of Walt. Among important artifacts are a writing desk used by him as a young school teacher on Long Island and a first edition of his epic book of poetry, Leaves of Grass. The Interpretive Center houses a museum shop and a multimedia area that offers a biographical video and a recording of Whitman's voice. The Center also contains a performance space with stage and seating for 80 guests, a meeting room (capacity 50), and kitchen facilities. Glass doors offer a panoramic view of the Grand Lawn and the 8' bronze statue of Whitman with Butterfly. The Gathering House, built 2004, offers space for exhibitions and meetings.
